



Cherokee Sister Infinity Scarf

Sister Cherokee is a quick and easy to knit infinity scarf, with multiple textures and loads of style! Knit in the round using worsted - bulky weight yarn, this no fuss accessory will add just the right pop of color to any outfit. Use a solid yarn to focus attention on the varying textures or a self striping yarn for attractive rings of color.

Materials – 200 yards worsted weight or 175 yards bulky weight yarn

Needles – 24” - 32” US 10.5 circular needle or size circular needle that will give you the proper gauge.
A second needle 1 – 2 sizes larger than needle used to get gauge, for bind off.

One stitch marker

Gauge – 13–14 stitches/4 inches in stockinette stitch

Cast on 96 stitches using backwards loop technique. (Backward loop cast on assures adequately loose cast on stitches.) Before joining to knit in the round, be sure there are no twists in the stitches, then turn stitches on left needle one revolution (one twist.) Join to knit in the round, by knitting into first cast on stitch. Place marker for beginning of round. Marker will be slipped each round.

Rounds 1 – 6 – Stockinette section - Knit in each stitch around to marker, taking care that the single twist in the stitches remains. Designer note - After the first stockinette section repeat, the twist will be permanently situated in your knitting, with no further attention to it necessary.

Rounds 7 – 12 – Reverse stockinette section - Purl in each stitch around.

Rounds 13 – 18 – *(Yarn over, knit 2 together) Repeat from * around.

Repeat Rows 1 – 18 (3) times, or until at least 4 yards of yarn remains. Bind off very loosely, using needle 1 – 2 sizes larger, to achieve a bind off as stretchy as the body of the infinity scarf. Cut yarn and pull through first bound off stitch. Weave in ends.
